

Annual Meeting

ABOUT 45 members and friends attended the Annual Meeting in the Martin Hall on 27th May, 1966. For the first time for many years, members met without tea, which is not now permitted by the New College authorities after the re-decoration of the Martin Hall.

The Rev. R. Stuart Loudon, D.D., presided, and welcomed one visitor from overseas, the Rev. J. E. Stewart, a former President of the daughter Society in New Zealand.

The Presidential Address on "Liturgy: The Way to Unity?" was well received, and on the call of Dr Keir the members present conveyed to Dr Loudon their cordial thanks for his excellent paper, and also for distinguished service to the Society as President, a term of office which included the historic Centenary Year.

It was reported that the circulation of the *Annual* had now reached 1216 copies, including overseas, and reference was made to the fact that the 1966 *Annual* was the 25th to be produced by the Rev. David Hodges as Editor. The congratulations and thanks of the Society were expressed to Mr Hodges by the President.

The Treasurer's statement showed a credit balance of £6, and the sum of £219 in the Centenary Fund. The Council were asked to consider the possibility of establishing a Centenary Lectureship.

The Rev. Thomas H. Keir, D.D., Melrose, was elected as President for the ensuing two years, and the Rev. G. Rendle Leathem, B.D., as Vice-President. The Secretary and Treasurer were continued in office, and the Council re-elected, with the addition of Miss V. M. Wallace Williamson, Edinburgh, the Rev. P. M. Gordon, Brechin, the Rev. G. Hunter, Glasgow, and Mr W. McCrea, Glasgow.
